Distinguished Chief Guest Thiru R. Kannan, I.A.S., Additional Secretary to Government of Tamilnadu, Water Resources Department, Esteemed Trust and College Presidents, Cherished Trust and College secretaries, Trustees, staff, and students, I am pleased to present the Annual Report of S.I.V.E.T. College, which documents its development and achievements for the year 2022-23. This year has been filled with numerous events and success stories, thanks to the dedication and team spirit of the staff, students, and management members. Following the Golden Jubilee, Covid obstructed the path of progress, culminating in despair and deprivation. Progress was slow at first, but it is now at its pinnacle in every way. The generosity of the administrators' impetus has resulted in progress ranging from infrastructure to Science. Furthermore, the management has proposed constructing a separate block for information and technology worth Ten crores, and the Ground Breaking Ceremony (Bhoomi Puja) was held on March 6, 2023.

A major focus of the college is to improve students' achievement. In addition, English communication skills development, special English courses and internships have been taken more seriously this year. Students with weak English proficiency were identified and given intensive English coaching outside of class. Our larger goal is to make our students employable. All of the amazing benefits achieved during the evaluation period resulted from the development and skill enhancement training programs such as Soft Skills Programs, Language and Communication Skills Programs, Yoga and Meditation Programs, Health and Hygiene Programs, and ICT/ Computing Skill Programs. The university results validate the staff's efforts and dedication, with many subjects receiving more than 90%.

The college has collaborated with community resources and EOTC to improve our literacy program and provide rich writing experiences. Classes and activities for gifted and talented students have been maintained. It has increased girls' participation in fitness and sports, particularly at the competitive level. Cultural groups, instrumental groups, Visual Art, Chess Clubs, Sports, Wearable Arts, and other activities were among those available. Many of the larger EOTC (Education outside the classroom) events (Greenwoods 22 & 23), Pongal festivals, and tournaments in which students participate were made possible by the unwavering support of the management authorities.

CURRICULUM FRAMEWORK TOOLS

- The College encourages computer-assisted instruction for all students. For this purpose, at least two out of every three classrooms in each department were outfitted with web-accessible Smartboards. This has expanded the range of teaching methods beyond traditional methods. It made teachers aware of the most recent e-teaching tools and also encouraged them to use and improve their lectures. Thanks to the painstaking efforts put in by Mr. P. Sundara Raman,
- Secretary, S.I.V.E.T.College and all management members for their approval.
- We hope to increase teacher capacity in 2023 by using the tools regularly to support teaching and learning, as well as to use the reports available to assist with reporting and data analysis.

PROFESSIONAL GROWTH CYCLES

The concept of the "Professional Growth Cycle" has taken the place of the requirement for teacher evaluations. The professional growth cycle is a more comprehensive approach that includes the following components:

IQAC- INTERNAL QUALITY ASSURANCE CELL.

It acts as a nodal agency of the Institution for coordinating quality-related activities, including the adoption and dissemination of best practices. Dr. A. Chitra, Associate Professor & Head, of the Department of Physics, is the director of our college. She has helped the NIRF team to revisit the guidelines required for ranking by conducting a special Program on the "National Institute Framework" Documentation Process on 17 th September 2022. The resource person was Dr. J. Prakash, Professor & Dean, Dept. of Instrumental Engineering, MIT, and Chrompet.

NATIONAL INSTITUTIONAL RANKING FRAMEWORK (NIRF)

The College, under Dr. Bala, the NIRF Coordinator and her team, registered for India Rankings 2022 and submitted the data on 27.10.2022 under DCS Headings, "College". The data for the three years 2019-2022 has been uploaded. The Managing Committee has generously funded Infrastructure and expanded the resources. This year, the College hopes to be in the NIRF Rank Band of 150-200.

ALL INDIA SURVEY ON HIGHER EDUCATION (AISHE)

Dr. Ezhilarasi, our college's Nodal Officer, and her team collected data for the academic year 2021-2022 on a variety of parameters, including teachers, student enrolment, programmes, examination results, education finance, and infrastructure, and uploaded it in December 2022.

Library

The library at SIVET College has evolved into a one-stop shop for high-quality content sourced from publishers all over the world. It now has both a digital and physical library, with a priceless collection of 67000 books, journals/magazines, and e-journals accessible via the UGC N-list, 80000 e-journals and 12000 e-books from INFLIBNET-Government of India, Shodh Ganga online platform, NDLI (NATIONAL DIGITAL LIBRARY OF INDIA), and MOOC. Students benefit from a centralized computer network with 30 latest-generation systems (Corei3) and a high-speed internet connection (100mbps).

National Cadet Corps (NCC):

In addition to the regular training Activities, the 6th Company of our college has detailed cadets for both the National & State level Camps. The Cadets also undertook Adventure and Social Activities Programs like Blood donation, coastal cleaning and Swachh Bharat.

National Social Service (NSS):

N.S.S. has been playing an important role in the college extension activities. The Management has always supported and encouraged the service-motivated activities of our College. Some of the activities of NSS are as follows: (1) Eye Camp, (2) Traffic Regulation Work, (3) Har Ghar Tiranga-Rally (4) Swachh Rally (5) Drug Abuse Awareness Rally, (6) Say No Plastic Rally, (7) Desilting of ponds, (8) Social Justice Day, (9) Martyr's Day and (10) Mega Job Fair. The NSS also conducts Blood Donation camps in hands with the NCC, YRC and University of Madras. A special camp at KUMARANKOTTAM was held this year with the theme of literacy campaigns. NSS volunteers involved themselves in the assembly, and state local body elections.

Sports & Games:

Our college's sports activities have a fairly dominant position at both the college and intercollegiate levels. The Physical Education department has a good infrastructure and holds tournaments and matches comparable to IPL games. The twenty-twenty matches have had an impact on the college's reputation. The Department holds annual sports competitions for the benefit of students (men and women students separately), with the winners receiving honour medallions and certificates.

Department Activities

Staff representatives from each department took part in Naan Mudhalvan Scheme (Govt. of Tamilnadu Initiative) and attended orientation and refresher courses in preparation for its implementation in the college.
